Update On Our Vision Process

Beginning in January of this year, Pastor Jeff announced our church would engage in a year of Visioning to discern where God is leading us in the years ahead. A vision team was formed and a kick-off meeting was held on March 6th. This visioning process engaged the Center for Healthy Churches with Jayne Davis, from First Baptist Wilmington, as our team's coach. Meredith Westbrook and Jim Vining were elected as Co-Chairs of our team and Amanda Ledford as team Secretary. The team has a wonderful mix of people with 16 members in total, equally divided between male and female; and 25% below the age of 30. The staff has been a part of the vision team as well.

To date the vision team has met numerous times, mostly through Zoom. We've conducted three congregational meetings and a community forum. The congregational meetings have asked: "Where have we been at our best?" "Where are we presently?" and "Where do we sense God leading us into the future?" Through prayer and conversation we are discerning the God-sized dreams for Oakland.

Pastor Jeff has also led three conversations surrounding the books *Simple Church*, *Hopeful Imagination*, and *Growing Young*. Pastor Jeff has also held three in person opportunities to discuss the process with any church member.

Going forward, we have a lot of work left in grouping church input into possible directions for our church. We have navigated the short months of summer through sub-group meeting and are looking forward to gathering once again as a whole team on September 11th.

The Vision team will present to the congregation a draft Vision Plan on Wednesday, November 10th, at 6:00PM. We encourage everyone to attend and provide feedback as we move forward.


Worship

Music Ministry

Music at OBC promotes music as a vehicle of worship, as well as a tool for spiritual growth and development for children, youth, and adults. Our teachers and directors are highly trained to provide all participants with an excellent musical experience as well as spiritual guidance.

Children's Choir (3 years - 5th grade)

Our Children's Choir program is designed to help our children, ages 3-5th grade, develop musically and spiritually as they learn music elements and develop singing technique. We use *Growing in Grace and Choristers Guild* curriculum to help our children become singers for the future and to grow in the knowledge of God's love. The children occasionally sing in the worship service, as well as present a Christmas pageant and lead Children's Sunday in the spring.
